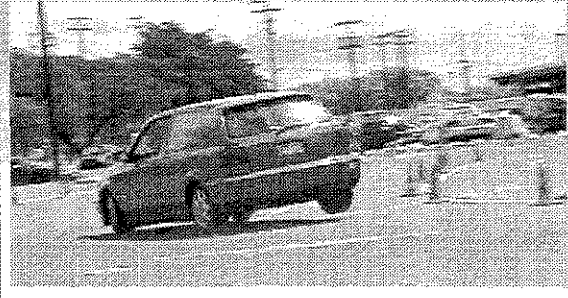
Editors Note:

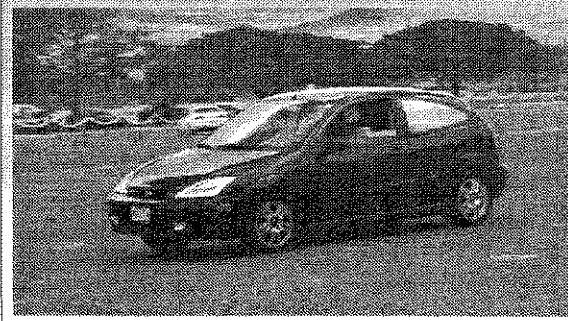
Robert Hechtman driving the wheels off (the ground) his VW Golf. Good for 2nd in FSP.

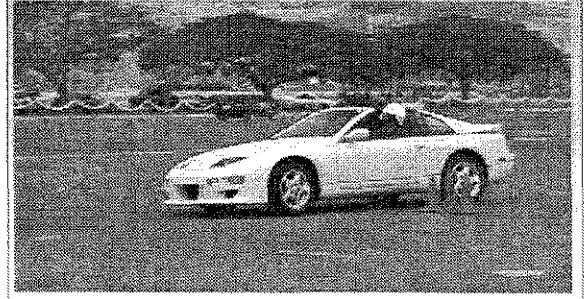
After a slight "mishap" in June, Gabe Hanohano returned to take 1st in H Stock (Ok so there only 2 cars, but a win is a
