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
The Journey To Topeka By: Curtis and Amy Lee

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Our vacation this year was a journey to the Solo II National Championship in Topeka, Kansas. We had reserved a set of full thread R1s in their trailer in case it rained. Watching the weather channel very closely, we finally decided to shave the new set of R1s and mount them for the National Championship in hopes of getting a little more grip.
