
the new tires, so the first day of National's would be less than optimum. I even considered looking at other tire brands, but we did not have the camber adjustment necessary to run them.


Did y'all miss me? Unfortunately my family and I couldn't attend last months autocross, but we did get a taste of national competition up in Topeka, Kansas at the
