times, (too much wing slowing the car down on the straights according to Martin) with the 3 litre 600+ horsepower engine blaring at "over 16000" rpms, and a top speed at over 320 kilometers per hour. At that speed, things go by amazingly quickly. Braking into corners is the most incredible sensation. I had heard of the 4 G's under braking though, so I expected the brakes to be awesome. Cornering forces are sick, and the acceleration is nearly as remarkable as the brakes. After four laps, I was ear to ear with a smile and wishing that I could go all day. At the same time, I was nearly sick and wanted to get the heck out of the car. It was really a blast. I felt like I had just been beat up by a gang of really big guys. The only way that I could describe the ride was "brutal." In a really good way, but brutal. It was the ride of my life! The guys that drive these cars have to be in really good shape, and have reflexes as sharp as nails. I was a fan before, but after this ride my respect for anyone driving at this level has gone up a lot.

The weekend ended with West McLaren Mercedes drivers Mika Hakkinen and David Coulthard finishing one two in the race, so the team was totally stoked. So was I. The problem is, now my whole perspective of what's fast has been turned completely upside down. And my desire to get behind the wheel and advance my driving dreams is now Fortunately, the feelings hotter than ever! that you get from blasting across the chop in 30 knot winds on a fast board or flying off the top of a perfect wave are pretty close a lot more tangible...less expensive, and a lot safer. So I'll probably stick to the water for at least a while longer.
